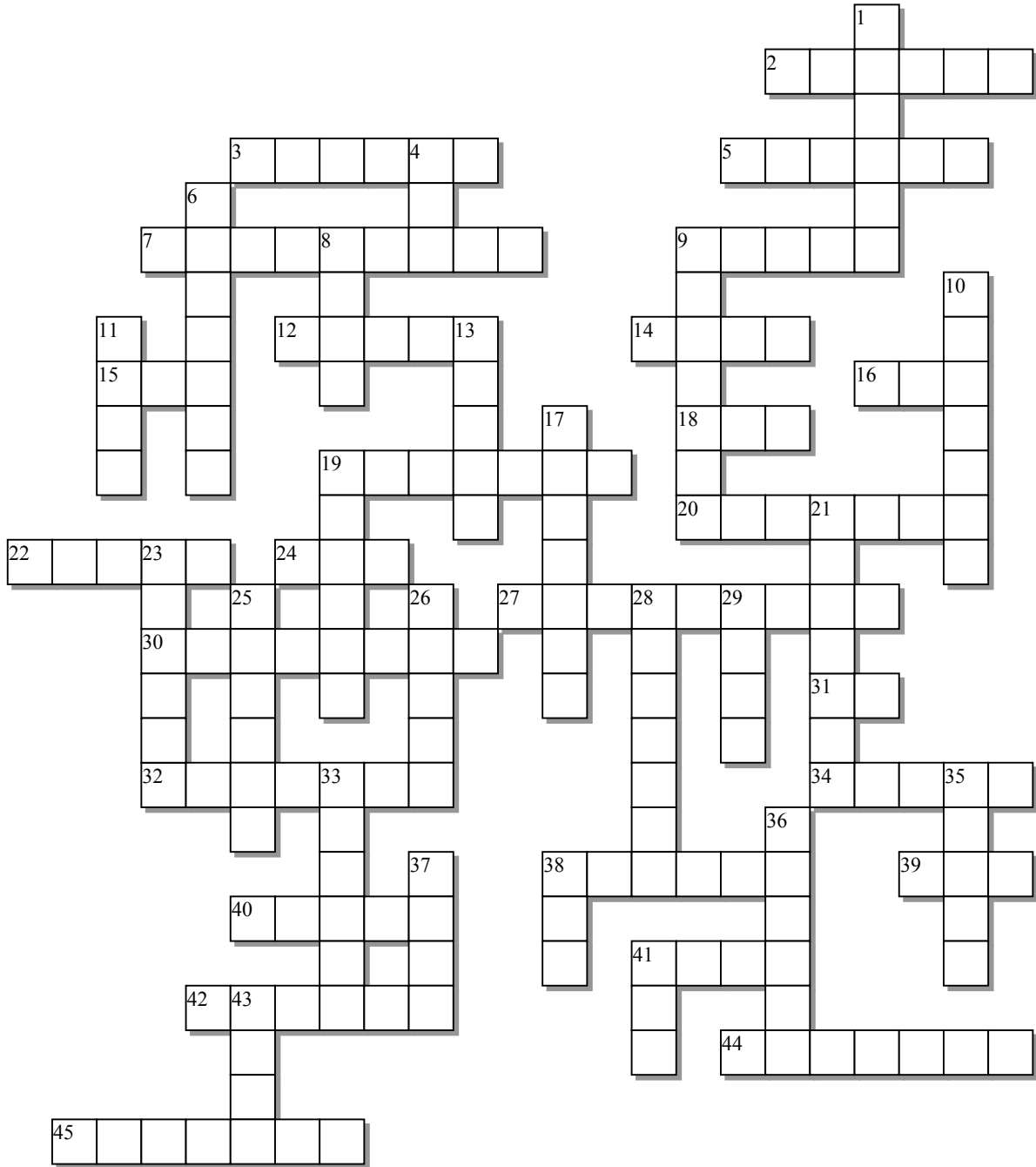

**implementus obsoleteus**



**Across:**

- 2 - small pot stand
- 3 - small mug, often carved out of wood
- 5 - they were made in "lightship" and "butto" forms
- 7 - sugar caster
- 9 - implements and utensils made entirely of wood
- 12 - burning log grabber
- 14 - principal ingredient of mush often eaten from a silver or pewter porringer
- 15 - piercing tool that could have been used in making a tin pie-safe [what is a pie safe? you ask?]
- 16 - soap was often made from fat of this domesticated creature
- 18 - it is unclear who Toby was, but he inspired a whimsical form of this object
- 19 - candle extinguisher
- 20 - enclosed lighting device with glass
- 22 - to start a fire, a striker was used in conjunction with this object
- 24 - coal bucket
- 27 - hot poker inserted in a tube used for smoothing ruffles on clothing: \_\_\_\_\_ iron
- 30 - hollowed out wooden bowl
- 31 - you better have one in order to be able to feed the fire
- 32 - glass, chemical-filled fire extinguisher designed to be smashed over a fire
- 34 - heavy, lidded cast iron cooking pot, often on legs is called a \_\_\_\_\_ oven
- 38 - a hogscraper was intended to hold this object
- 39 - could be flintlock or percussion
- 40 - hinged iron pot hanger
- 41 - fuel
- 42 - three footed iron pot
- 44 - very small stool
- 45 - small canteen

**Down:**

- 1 - covered wooden storage container
- 4 - refrigerant harvested from ponds and lakes
- 6 - small keg popular in England [this one is nearly impossible]
- 8 - a posnet is made of this material
- 9 - Adjustable iron hooks for holding pots, candles or lamps
- 10 - tool, sometimes sailor-made ivory, used as pie crimper: \_\_\_\_\_ wheel
- 11 - mechanical roasting device for rotating meat as it cooks
- 13 - folding yarn winder
- 17 - fire starting blower
- 19 - reflective, wall hanging candle holder
- 21 - handled drinking cup with hinged lid
- 23 - this product was ground by a small, handled, semi-circular tin grater
- 25 - wooden pan for cooling milk
- 26 - lamp that burned fat trimmings or fish oil
- 28 - four legged brass or iron stand to keep food warm in front of the fire or over coals
- 29 - a not-so-obsolete toothed implement for clearing ash
- 33 - improved oil lamp with reservoir mounted above the burner
- 35 - butter maker
- 36 - spark catcher
- 37 - sometimes consumed from a flagon
- 38 - by product of a corn sheller
- 41 - uncased clock works that hung on the wall
- 43 - long handled, wood or iron tool for reaching into the bake oven
